
Nursery - In nursery this week, we have been helping the new children to settle in and learn how to play with our toys. We have been practising sharing and turn-taking games. We loved rolling a ball to each other in PE.

Things to look forward to in Nursery:

Next week we are looking forward to talking about who our friends are, and who is in our family.

Year 2 - this week we have been learning where adults get money from. We have talked about different jobs and how, in some cases, they get money from the government when they cannot work.

Things to look forward to in Year 2: we are looking forward to learning the difference between a 'want and a 'need.



Year 1 Daffodil - This week Daffodil class have been learning about things that we need to stay safe from. The children have identified things that may present dangers to them and discussed these amongst each other. We have discussed the NSPCC PANTS rule which can be found below, and the children have designed their own pants.

Sophie gets £5 weekly pocket money and wants a £40 video game. She learns how to save and puts aside £2.50 a week. After 16 weeks, she buys the video game.

Year 6 - We have been learning about the emotional aspects of money and how to cope with those feelings. We have looked at different scenarios of how, when and why people save money and how it makes them feel. 
Things to look forward to in Year 6:

Year 3 - In PSHE this week we have started a new topic all about money. We learned about different ways to pay for things and we talked about which we preferred, which were safer and which were easier.

Things to look forward to in Year 3:

We're excited to learn more about money - how to budget it and how we might like to earn it!





Year 4 - this term's topic is 'economic wellbeing'. Yesterday we looked at 'value for money'. We had a big discussion about what this means and then looked at different items to decide if they were good or bad value for money. We then had to try to sell a product to a buyer!

Consider why someone might want to buy your item and its special features or benefits.

- ✓ Be ready to explain why your item is worth the price you have set.
- ✓ Be prepared to negotiate, but remember how low you are willing to go
 with the price. It is important not to undervalue your item.
- ✓ Be persuasive but fair.

Things to look forward to in Year 4:

We're looking forward to learning more about how to keep our money safe.

Year 5 - Before the holidays, as part of our PSHE unit (citizenship), the children learned about what happens if someone is suspected of committing a crime. We then held a 'mock trail' where we created a Year 5 law court. We used this to investigate a missing t-shirt. We had lawyers, a jury, defendants and even witnesses.

This week, we have looked at how people are rewarded or recognised for supporting and helping their community. To start with we discussed different communities that we are part of or could be part of, how people could make positive contributions to their community and famous examples of these people (including Marcus Rashford, Greta Thunberg and Captain Tom Moore).





Things to look forward to in Year 5:

Next week, we will be discussing pressure groups and how they can campaign (respectfully and peacefully) for positive change.



Reception - This term in PSHE, we are learning how to be a good friend. This week, we have been working on being supportive and encouraging our friends to be brave. We have been putting on shows in our stage area and have been clapping and cheering to encourage our friends to feel brave.
